HOW DOES WHAT WE AS COMMON MINISTRY ARE DOING AFFECT THE CHURCH'S RACIAL AND SOCIAL JUSTICE WORK?

Meeting held in person in the Chapel Classroom.

Moderator Tim Harder called the meeting to order at 6:02 p.m.

Gathering Prayer: Achim shared a prayer.

Additions to the Agenda: One item was added to New Business.

Congregational Joys and Concerns: Joys and concerns were shared.

Minister's Report: In addition to the work that will be reported in the Ministry reports and minutes, Bridget is sad to report that the German exchange pastor mentioned last month has decided to go elsewhere. There was a JOSHUA prayer service today at the GB Correctional Facility to pray for the inmate who was murdered. Bridget will be teaching Confirmation Sundays at 9 a.m. before worship at least through Christmas. Bridget's annual Advent retreat with colleagues last week included planning for Advent services and a time to Pastor each other. She will start the process for hiring a music director next week, which will include a listening session after worship on 12/11. Although staff hiring is entirely within Bridget's purview, she plans to seek a recommendation from Common Ministry. Beth will write the newsletter article for December.

Clerk's Report

The minutes for the regular meeting of October 13, 2022 were approved (Bridget/Achim).

Treasurer's Report

Sandy distributed the regular financial report (attached). She noted that income looks pretty good for the month. Expenses were less than income. Facilities expenses were a bit higher due to service need on the heating system and paying for the cleaning service engaged until Andrew was hired. The report was accepted (Betty/Achim).

New Business

- <u>Nominating Committee Report</u>: Heather reported there are 4 open slots, only 2 of which are Chairs. She expects to be done soon. Thanks to Heather, Sandy and Bridget for working together to share the leadership on Nominating.
- <u>2023 Budget Update:</u> Sandy and Bridget have been working on the budget for 2023. Bridget excused herself for the discussion of proposed changes in staff compensation. Tentative guidance was given to Sandy for budget development and presentation to Common Ministry next meeting.

8 adults 2 youth joined the church on Sunday. They are working on setting up "First Friends" to help orient new members to church and its activities/opportunities.

OUTREACH

Outreach is partnering with an organization focused on alcohol/drug use issues for a bingo/chili fundraiser on 12/10. Outreach will be receiving a grant to improve the Blessing Box and the storage of Blessing Box supplies. Giving Tree will donate to 5 organizations this year (see list attached). Saturday is the monthly food drive. The soup sale on election day was very successful. Heifer donations stand at a little over \$4,000.

STEWARDSHIP

Getting bids on replacing the northeast door. Other exterior doors have been repaired. Andrew doing great and wants to take on a lot of new tasks. Have installed electronic key pads to replace keys in a couple of locations.

WORSHIP

New Year's Day worship plan is for a Jazz Brunch potluck. Ministries are asked to help with setup and cleanup. The MLK Sunday service will include an annual offering to serve as a form of reparation in acknowledgement that our Music Ministry at Union includes spirituals and classical music by African American composers on occasion. That the offering will be given to a local organization that serves the Black community within the area.

Indian Child Welfare Act Rally November 9

Justin Peche, member of JOSHUA Environmental Task Force, asked the Board to support a rally he organized on the status of the Supreme Court review of the Indian Child Welfare Act. In an email discussion the Board directed Caitlin Haynes to post a flyer advertising the event on JOSHUA's social media outlets. Caltlin Haynes, Co-President Sheila DeLuca and I attend the rally. Indigenous nations are concerned that children will be removed from their communities if the act, passed in 1978, is found unconstitutional or If their sovereign rights are diminished by the court. Heartfelt testimonies by tribe members who were separated from their families and placed in non-native homes were shared.

There were some concerns from some board members and religious leaders about JOSHUA's role in supporting Justice' request without formal Board discussion. The Board will be developing a procedure to handle future requests of this type.

Organizer Changes

Most recent JOSHUA organizer, Maureen Perkins, resigned in October after being offered a new job working for the Oneida Nation. Caitlin Haynes, most recently Vista Volunteer working with Maureen, has taken on the interim role of JOSHUA coordinator and organizer. She will be working part-time for JOSHUA and part-time for Wisdom. A search committee will begin working on finding a replacement in January.

Annual JOSHUA Banquet

Approximately 70 people attended. The amount raised will be announced at the November board meeting.

Green Bay FXPO Chapter

Plans for starting an EXPO Chapter will resume in January.

Maureen Perkins has volunteered to assist Deliliah McKinney in getting the chapter up and running.

JOSHUA Electronic Recycling Fundraiser

Raised \$300 on day of event. Recycling company has yet to send us the check for the remainder.
