HOW DOES WHAT WE AS COMMON MINISTRY ARE DOING AFFECT THE CHURCH'S RACIAL AND SOCIAL JUSTICE WORK?

Meeting held in person in the Chapel Classroom. Moderator Tim Harder called the meeting to order at 6:03 p.m. He passed around a sign up for prayer and treats.

Gathering Prayer: Tim shared a prayer.

Additions to the Agenda: None.

Congregational Joys and Concerns: Joys and concerns were shared.

Minister's Report: In addition to the work that will be reported in the Ministry reports and minutes, Bridget was asked to serve on the Board of Directors of St. Norbert's Masters of Theological Studies Program. She gave thanks for all everyone did for Christmas. She has heard from a number of colleagues that many churches are still struggling as they come back from COVID and we are in a really strong place, which speaks well of the vitality of the congregation and that what we are doing matters to folks. Much time has been spent with Eric around the annual report. She reported that the music director search committee agreed best direction is to offer Haley the staff position and she has accepted. Sheboygan artist Toril Fisher has created a series of paintings called Divine Ambiguity, depicting modern icons of social issues, such as children in cages at the border, Christ on the cross in Ukraine. Bridget is working with her to have it installed here by February 19 for Transfiguration, likely in the church hall. She would like coffee hour to be a little more special on that day, and will plan for some adult ed focused on the exhibit. She is also contemplating a color brochure for the exhibit but will communicate specifics to Common Ministry when they are available. The exhibit will be up at least through Easter. Some of the art will be for sale. Wants to print a color brochure of paintings and may ask for an e-vote for that expenditure. Jeff Gibson agreed to write a Friday newsletter article.

Clerk's Report

The minutes for the regular meeting of December 8, 2022 were approved (Heather/Sandy).

A thank you not from Eric was read. Clay reported that an email vote was taken beginning December 14 approving up to \$9,648 for the purchase and installation of a replacement door for the entryway to the Mayflower wing from LaForce, Inc. to be paid for out of funds already designated for the Capital Campaign.

Treasurer's Report

Sandy distributed the regular financial report (attached). She expressed that we have done amazingly well given the pandemic, etc. We ended the year with expenses exceeding income by approximately \$5,000. Sees nothing out of the ordinary. She also noted that the attached report is preliminary, but should be close. Report was accepted (Achim/Heather).

There will be an eating together opportunity on 2/12.

- <u>Nominating Committee Report</u>: Currently there are two open positions Outreach Chair and Gifts & Memorials disbursements. Betty, Achim, and Jeff will be leaving CM. Thanks to them for all they have done for the church.
- <u>Bylaw #4 Update</u>: It was agreed that we would continue to consider this and leave any approval process to a future annual meeting.
- <u>Capital Campaign Leadership</u>: Tim would like to be able to start recruiting people to work on the CC Cmte as soon as it is (hopefully) approved at the Annual Meeting. He distributed a list of folks who had been suggested in the interviews. Please provide Tim any feedback no later than Monday. It was agreed he could start discussions with potential committee members now. Let Tim know if you would like to serve.
- <u>2023 Budget</u>: Sandy distributed a proposed budget for presentation at the Annual Meeting (attached). After discussion, the motion to recommend presentation of the budget for Congregational approval was approved (Clay/Heather).
- <u>Generosity Team Update</u>: Pledges are \$14,000 ahead of last year.

After serving since 2019, effective February 1st, I will no longer be Union's representative to the JOSHUA Board. I am focusing on deepening my work as a member of the JOSHUA Transformational Justice Task Force. It has been a privilege to serve on the Board for the last 4 years. I have learned many things about what it takes to change people's opinions in ways that actually build a more justice society.

JOSHUA Organizer Hiring Team

A posting for a new part time Community Coordinator has been created and posted with Indeed.com, Wisdom, and the Wisconsin of Churches. Jeff Gibson and Steve Hartman are on the hiring team. The team has begun to review 14 candidates. The posting will remain open until the position is filled.

WISDOM Transformation Justice Campaign

December 8, 2022

JOSHUA Transformational Justice Task Force members Rev. Marian Rohloff, Chair Jim Cairns and I joined approximately 100 other WISDOM members in the Madison capitol to kick off the WISDOM Transformation Justice Campaign. The day began with an engrossing and poignant public hearing followed by visits with legislative staff members and ending with debriefing and planning sessions to ready for the Madison Action Day scheduled for April 28. JOSHUA is hoping that several members from the community will join us in trying to impact the state budget process.

<u>Treatments and Diversions Legislative Initiative</u> Please reach out to your Assembly Representative and your Senator and ask them to co-sponsor LRB-0778.

A <u>bipartisan</u> group of legislators (GOP Assembly Rep Paul Tittle and Senator Andre Jacque; and Democratic Assembly Rep Evan Goyke and Senator Mark Spreitzer) are looking for co-sponsors for a bill that would achieve one of our objectives for TAD -- it would expand the program so it could serve people with mental health challenges (not just substance use disorder). Their memo inviting other legislators to co-sponsor is attached. Also attached is WISDOM's "position paper" on TAD, if you want to know a little more about why this is something we have worked very hard for, for a long time.
