Thank You and Praise Be to God!

We did it!

Or more accurately, we're doing it! After several years of praying and planning, our church community has engaged in a successful capital campaign that will enhance how we are able to utilize our building and grounds for mission, provide Outreach Ministry with resources to make a real impact, and create a stable financial footing for future capital needs.

As a pastor, I'm always reluctant to assess ministry by the numbers. The number of people at an event does not measure the quality of the impact our work has on people's lives, cannot begin to quantify the transformative effect of what we do.

And yet, at this stage of our Building for Faith in Action Capital Campaign, I do look at your responses to this effort as a measure of our church's vitality.

Not only does the list of projects address critical infrastructure needs, such as replacing the Mayflower doors, the west side of the church hall roof, and the elevator motor, it also allocates resources toward projects that speak to who our church is, including installing solar on the Mayflower roof, renovating the lower level to better accommodate both our internal child and youth programming as well as the needs of mission partners, and creating a fund through which Outreach Ministry will be able to engage in meaningful justice and outreach work.

The fact that our community responded to this measured, mission aligned campaign as robustly as we have speaks to the vitality of what we're doing. You believe in Union. You believe in the Gospel of God's all inclusive love. You believe in loving our neighbors, no exceptions, and putting that love into action. And you've pledged to keep the infrastructure that undergirds these ministries robust.

Capital Campaign Next Steps:

- Continue to pray for the ministries of our church. This may seem obvious, but rooting all that our congregation does in prayer is critical. Prayer makes sure we stay humble. Prayer infuses what we do with inspiration.
- Fulfill our pledges. The timeframe set out for fulfilling pledges is three years; Stewardship and Common Ministries are staggering the initiation of projects based on monies on hand. - Pledge to Union's fall budget campaign. While the Building for Faith in Action Capital Campaign funds essential infrastructure needs, the fall budget campaign is what keeps the lights on. With inflation, it will be critical that our donors exceed their 2023 pledges by 3 to 5%. The Generosity Team hopes the theme of this year's fall budget pledge campaign, Union: Love In Action, will energize, inspire, and once again highlight just how vital our church's ministries are. Materials will be mailed in late September.
- Watch your church communications to see updates as our projects get underway, and thank one another for investing in our church.

Faith Formation kicks off with an open house on September 17. Children, parents and teachers will get to know one another in their classrooms, with K4-1st and 2nd-4th graders in the Mayflower I and II classrooms on the lower level of the church, 5th and up in the Fellowship Room on the second level, and high school in the Chapel Classroom.

The curriculum we will use this year will be "Shine," a dynamic Faith Formation curriculum that engages Christian communities and families in their life together through Bible Stories, spiritual practices, peacemaking, service, and more.

PRIDE Alive September 23

Union is excited to again have a booth at NEW PRIDE Alive at the Brown County Fairgrounds on September 23. We will have treats, information about Union, a gallery of LGBTQIA+ family photos, and will offer glitter blessings!

Love Life East Annual Diaper Drive

Our annual diaper drive for Love Life East is taking place now through September 10. Love Life provides a partial supply of diapers to low income families for babies ages 0 to 3 years. A family can get diapers once a month. That is a package of 100 for newborn to size 2 and a package of 75 for sizes 3 and up. The greatest need is for sizes 5 and 6.

The first 6 months of this year, a monthly average of 165 families came for diapers. A total of 3,753 packages of diapers were given out from January through June. Love Life is making a difference. It also provides formula, layettes for newborns, gently used clothing and baby furniture.

Parson's Purse In Need of Funds

All-Church Retreat September 8-10, 2023

Our All-Church Retreat is a weekend of fun, fellowship, and reflection. The retreat takes place at Moon Beach Camp which is in St. Germain just west of Eagle River and is part of the Outdoor Ministry program of the United Church of Christ. It sits on the shores of Moon Lake and Little Saint Germain Lake. Cabins overlook Moon Lake, and each is furnished, heated, and has a bathroom with a shower. There is a beautiful lodge, and the camp is fully staffed with helpful people.

People arrive Friday evening, partaking of snacks and fellowship time around the lodge fireplace. We are treated to three meals on Saturday and brunch on Sunday. Our Saturday morning session this year will focus on fostering a sense of belonging. Camp staff will once again offer a Saturday morning program for our children at the same time as the adult session.

Afternoons and evenings are up to you. There will be activities, planned and impromptu. There is a beach with watercraft, hiking trails and places to sit, read and reflect. Evening is game time with ice cream sundaes and a bonfire.

Sunday, we enjoy brunch and worship informally. We are usually on our way by 11 o'clock.

Cost for the retreat is \$175 per adult and \$30 per child. Financial aid is available (talk to Pastor Bridget). You can sign up to attend the retreat by contacting the church office, or by filling out a form at Union Central.

Sunday Morning Adult Faith Formation Fall/Winter Calendar 2023

Gather in Bagby Chapel at 9 a.m. (first and third Sundays of the month) for these informative and inspiring conversations:

September 17 — <u>Judge Donald Zuidmulder</u> — Brown County Judge Zuidmulder will talk about the county's Treatment Courts and Diversions programs which he pioneered and how they have been powerful alternatives to incarceration. Under his leadership, Brown County has led the state in implementing these programs.

October 1 — <u>Habitat for Humanity</u> — Representatives from Habitat for Humanity, which was brought to Brown County by members of Union, will join us to share their recent efforts.

October 15 — <u>St. John's Shelter</u> — If homelessness isn't visible, people may think it doesn't exist. This past shelter season, St. John's Ministries served 605 individuals with 18,308 nights of shelter. They are preparing for another busy season, which begins November 1. Jesse Brunette of St. John's Ministries will provide an update on their critically important mission of serving the homeless and housing insecure in Green Bay.

November 5 — <u>Phil Hauck</u> — In his book, "The Golden Age of Brown County Enterprise," Union member Phil Hauck described the very entrepreneurial activities of five important Green Bay companies. Since then, innovation has slowed down, threatening our prosperity. He'll explain why, and what community leaders are doing about it.

November 19 — <u>Nicole Polarek</u> — In July of 2022, Union member Nicole Polarek and her family were inches away from the mass shooting at the Highland Park (Illinois) Independence Day Parade. With pictures and stories, Nicole will offer an intimate, harrowing view into gun violence.

December 3 — Wonder-Full Christmas: The Nativity as the Mysterious but Real in Art and Music — Dr. Michael Lukens will explore how Christians have marveled at the story of Jesus' birth for at least twenty centuries and how music and art help to shape our understandings.

December 17 — <u>Christmas Carols: the Meanings</u> — Dr. Julie Black Harder will lead our final session of the semester in which we'll discover how Matthew's and Luke's proclamations about Jesus were translated into traditional Christmas carols. We'll also consider how recent re-wording of some carols has obscured some of those messages.


