





Our sanctuary is equipped with a hearing loop. You can access the loop by activating the T-coil in

### Our Housing Offering is May 12


Our congregation is generous. We will extend that generosity through our Housing Offering on May 12. This offering supports the work of the Ecumenical Partnership for Housing (EPH).
