HOW DOES WHAT WE AS COMMON MINISTRY ARE DOING AFFECT THE CHURCH'S RACIAL AND SOCIAL JUSTICE WORK?

Moderator Heather Collins called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Congregational Jovs and Concerns: Jovs and concerns were shared.

Minister's Report: Some Osseo 4th and 5th grade teachers have reached out to Bridget looking for a place for their classes to sleep on their two annual trips this summer. They would provide proof of insurance, and the kids will sleep on the floor. Bridget reported that the Common Ministry letter regarding pastoral boundaries has not received a response, although current behavior has been in accord with the guidelines. Bridget and the Personnel Committee had a good meeting to discuss a few policy handbook revisions and they are in the planning stages for her first performance review. Retreat team has discerned the retreat topic and facilitators have stepped up. She noted that she participated in the ordination of the new pastor of First UCC on Webster. His presence should make it easier for our congregations to work together when appropriate.

Clerk's Report

The minutes for the regular meeting of February 13 and March 13, 2025 will be approved by an email vote after they are redistributed.

Treasurer's Report

Sandy distributed the December budget summary (attached) and as well distributed a confirming copy of the corrected 2025 budget, noting the prior agreement to send it out with quarterly giving statements. She expressed that we are still doing well year to date. Motion to put on file approved (Sandy/Kathy).

- <u>Nomination for Worship Vice Chair:</u> Motion to approve Lou Norsetter to fill the vacant Worship Vice Chair position was approved (Betty/Denise).

- <u>Sanctuary Piano Repair:</u> The now-retired piano tuner in December noted a crack in the piano sound board which does not require immediate repair. The new tuner, however, has found that the action (hammers) is quite worn. He proposes to return in early June to make the repair. Stewardship requests approval to allocate up to \$750 from the Betty Brown Fund for the repair. Approved.

Dear Common Ministry,

Foremost the Madison Action Day scheduled for April 10 is huge. Busloads of people from around Wisconsin will converge in Madison for a rally with speakers addressing the proposed state budget and "dialogue" in current hearings. Following the gathering at the Madison Masonic Center the demonstration process to the capitol building for more and diverse speakers addressing systemic justice issues and prison reform. This will be followed by face to face conversations with individual legislators, again expressing concerns around prison reform and community needs.

Clearly, these past two months have been a caldron of issues in housing, education, a variety of community needs. Awareness focusing on solitary confinement and crowded conditions at GBCI and other Wisconsin prisons continues with prayer vigils on the 23rd of each month. JOSHUA was represented at recent "Hands Off" and other rallies Laura Robson represented JOSHUA addressing HUD concerns. Mark Rice, statewide coordination for prison reform, Steve Warner and Tom Denk spoke against parole revocation with no additional violation at the recent hearings around the state. This phenomenon, Non Violation Revocation, continues to discriminate against paroles in Wisconsin, if unjust, arbitrary and contributes to increasing overcrowding conditions.

We continue efforts to address homelessness, ecological justice and coordinating with other Beloved Community oriented groups in Brown County. Additionally, we cooperated with the Nrcat, National Religious Cammpaign Against Torture.
