


At Union, we are all the body of Christ together:

#### THE INVITATION

- L. The table of bread and wine is now to be made ready. Come to this table, you who have much faith and you who would like to have more;
- All. You who have been here often and you who have not been for a long time, if ever.

#### SHARING OF THE BREAD AND CUP

Communion servers will pass trays of bread, red wine, and white grape juice through the pews. Please let an usher know if you would prefer to commune with the prepackaged Communion elements, and they will bring one to you. Please hold the bread and cup until all are served so that we may commune together. Gluten-free bread is in the paper cup in the center of the tray.

The host at this table is Jesus Christ. In Christ's name and spirit, we invite all to partake of God's grace. Children may participate according to their parents' wishes.







