

Leader: We confess that we see wrongdoing and grow weary, the times we hear the cries of our neighbors and turn away. All too often, we cling to what we have, forgetting that generosity is a pathway to freedom. Let us take a moment to offer our silent prayers of confession to God.

(Silence is kept.)

Leader: Let us pray.

All: Forgive us, O God. Cleanse our hearts, not with guilt, but with grace. Renew in us the courage of Zacchaeus— to climb higher when we cannot see clearly, to listen when you call our name, and to give joyfully as a sign of your transforming love.

Teach us again to live by faithfulness—as individuals, as a church, and as a people committed to Jesus' ways of justice and peace. Amen.

SHARING OF THE BREAD AND CUP

Communion servers will pass trays of bread, red wine, and white grape juice through the pews. Please let an usher know if you would prefer to commune with the prepackaged Communion elements, and they will bring one to you. Please hold the bread and cup until all are served so that we may commune together. Gluten-free bread is in the paper cup in the center of the tray.

The host at this table is Jesus Christ. In Christ's name and spirit, we invite all to partake of God's grace. Children may participate according to their parents' wishes.

PRAYERS OF CONSECRATION, OF THE PEOPLE, AND OF OUR LORD

Please join us in praying the Lord's Prayer in these words or a translation meaningful to you. Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory, forever. Amen.







