

*PRAYER OF CONFESSION: (in unison)

Holy One, You call us to wake from sleep, to rise into the dawning light, to walk in the ways of peace we can scarcely imagine.

Yet we confess that we are often more committed to what we already know than to the wonder of what might yet be. We cling to fear, armor ourselves with cynicism, mistake numbness for wisdom. You dream of a world where weapons become tools for tending life, but we confess how easily we sharpen our words, our judgments, and our habits of distrust. You summon us to the mountain of your teaching, yet we confess how often we settle at its base, satisfied with partial truths and small hopes.

Wake us, God of Advent. Startle us with awe. Shake loose our tired assumptions. Turn our gaze toward the paths we have not yet dared to walk. Clothe us once again with the radiance of Christ, that we may live as children of the day— courageous, openhearted, and ready for the beauty you are unfolding. Amen.

*ASSURANCE OF PARDON: (in unison)

Beloved of God, the night is far gone; the day is near. Before we ever turn toward the light, the Light has already turned toward us. In Christ, God's mercy is wide awake. In Christ, God's wonder meets us in our weariness. In Christ, we are forgiven, freed, and invited into a new possibility.

So let us rise, take heart, and walk in the light of the Holy One— for the dawn is breaking, and hope is being born in us even now. Amen

Rejoice, rejoice! Emmanuel is come to birth where all God's children dwell.


Note on updated lyrics:

Maren C. Tirabassi retired as a UCC pastor after 42 years and is the author of 23 books. She attended Harvard Divinity School and studied at Union Theological Seminary. She was recognized as the Poet Laureate of Portsmouth, New Hampshire from 2021-2023, and more of her work can be found on her website, giftsinopenhands.com.

In 2024, Maren offered the following on her updated lyrics for this hymn: "I re-wrote the lyrics to 'O Come, O Come, Emmanuel' last year particularly for those uncomfortable with the use of the word 'Israel' used in the original as to signify all people in need, but now referring to a particular nation. Here are the first two verses for anyone who wishes and the third verse as in the original."
