

THE BOND OF UNION (in unison)

Giving our all as we have been given all...

We accept the religion of love and service which Jesus lived and taught, and declare it our purpose to strive to do the will of God, and to make the Christ Spirit dominant in our lives and in all human relations.



Leader: Last week, we lit the candle of Hope. Today we kindle Peace. Not the peace of quietism or compliance, but the peace that interrupts, rearranges, and realigns.

All: This Peace rises from wonder that refuses to look away.

Leader: John the Baptist cried out in the wilderness, not to frighten us, but to awaken us—to startle us into noticing what is possible when we prepare room for a different world.

All: His wildness is a kind of wonder, calling us toward change.

Leader: The Peace of God-With-Us grows when we allow awe to reorder our priorities—when wonder loosens our grip on old assumptions and leads us into repair, connection, and shared liberation.

All: Peace begins when we are willing to be transformed.

Leader: We light this candle of Peace, the peace that emerges when wonder becomes action, when changed hearts lead to changed systems, when we follow the cry from the wilderness toward a more just way.

All: May Peace be birthed among, within, and through us this Advent. O Come, O Come, Emmanuel.

*PRAYER OF CONFESSION: (in unison)

Holy God, we confess the times our desires for personal gain sometimes come at the expense of others; the times we regard unfamiliar people as threats to our safety, the times we fear the poor, that their fate may become ours; the times we feel helpless to confront powers that oppress our neighbors (and thereby ourselves), some in our own community; the times we place our personal salvation ahead of all others; the ways we have forgotten God's desire to save the entire world, not just our personal space. God of grace and mercy and healing and hope, we ask forgiveness for our fears and shortsightedness. Amen.

* <u>ASSURANCE OF PARDON</u>: (in unison)

Help us hear Isaiah's words that it is not too late, Everloving God. New growth from old stumps; a branch rising from buried, gnarly roots. The prophets call not for our demise for our faults, but new growth, similar to pruning what we no longer need. Isaiah and John the Baptist both want us to prepare for a new life, much as we would clean house for an important guest. With their assurance, may we be renewed to the holy life of righteousness and justice. Amen.



SHARING OF THE BREAD AND CUP

Communion servers will pass trays of bread, red wine, and white grape juice through the pews. Please let an usher know if you would prefer to commune with the prepackaged Communion elements, and they will bring one to you. Please hold the bread and cup until all are served so that we may commune together. Gluten-free bread is in the paper cup in the center of the tray.


Christmas Fund Offering is Next Sunday, December 14
