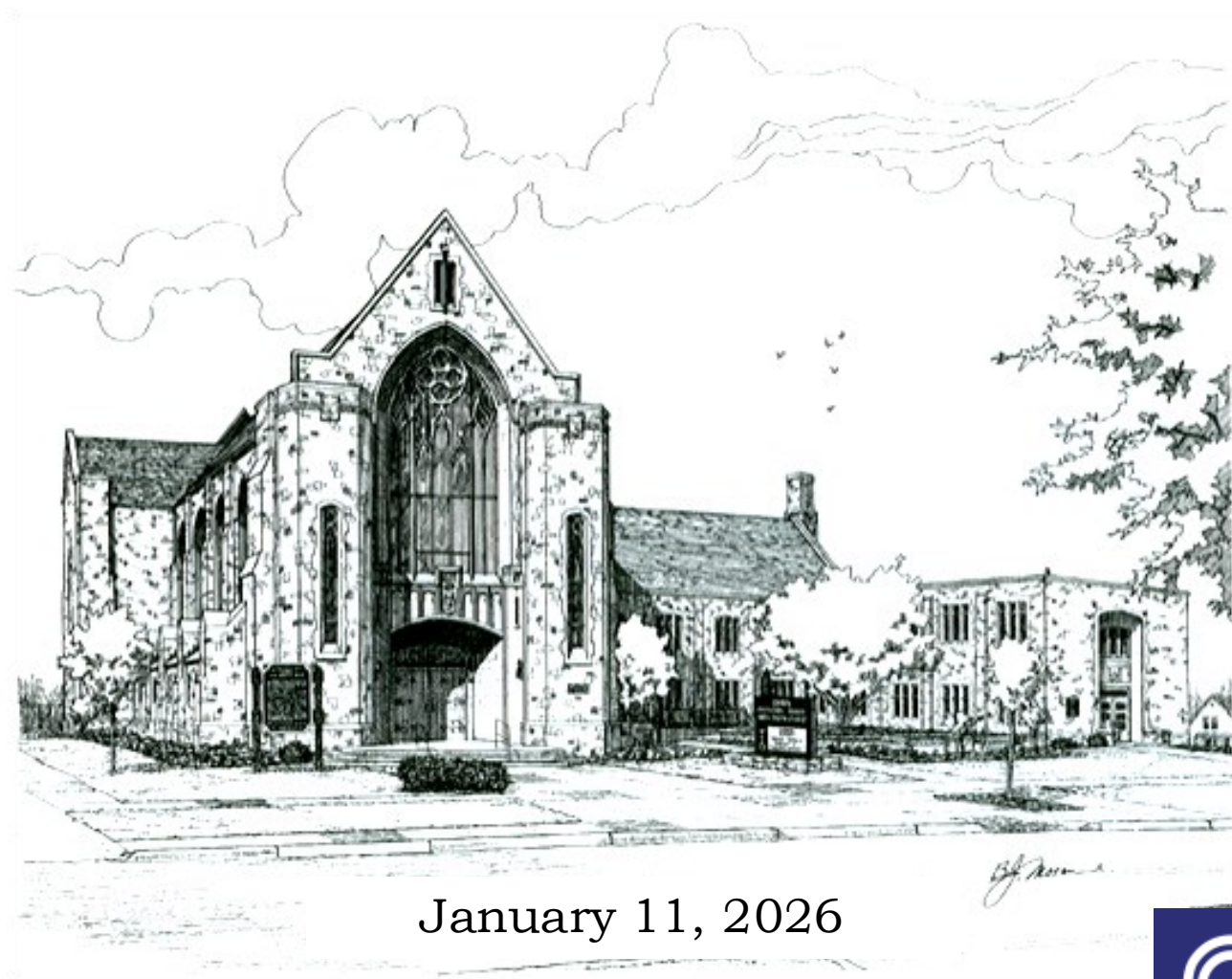

We confess that we fear the waters that change us, the ways we cling to old identities even when your Spirit is hovering, ready to make us new.

Wash away our sin once more, Source of Life. Remind us of our baptismal calling. Return us to the truth of who we are in you. Amen.

*** ASSURANCE OF PARDON: (in unison)**

Hear this good news: At the waters of baptism, God did not wait for perfection. God spoke belovedness first. In Jesus Christ, we are forgiven before we are finished, claimed before we are certain, loved beyond our fear and failure.

The same Spirit that descended like a dove still rests upon us, still calls us God's own, still sends us out in peace. You are forgiven. You are beloved. You are free to live as such. Amen.
